

Thoughts From Francis



Dear Friends,

Rather than sharing, as usual, our thoughts about various aspects of healing, I want to tell you news about some of the important things that are happening to us.

The first is that we are to renew our wedding vows on Saturday, July 31, and are honored to have Bishop John Snyder (the local Roman Catholic bishop) preside. This will be a small gathering of a few friends, meeting in great joy. When we announced in the last Newsletter that we had received a "dispensation," many of you asked what that was. Technically it means that my request to "be reduced to the lay state" has, after 13 years, been granted and that we are free to marry in the Roman Catholic Church, and, most especially, that we are now welcome to receive the sacraments there.

One of our Protestant friends put it in ordinary language by congratulating us on receiving our "pardon." That puts it very simply.

To us the most joyful aspect is the <u>reconciliation</u> part of it all. In fact, after word of the dispensation got out, we received, within a month, invitations to speak from five Roman Catholic groups.

Having spoken of this joy, we also want to say how much we feel part of our Episcopalian friend's community, and how indebted we are to Bishop Frank Cerveny and his wife Emmy for inviting us to come to Jacksonville and to move our CHM

center here from Clearwater, FL. Their unfailing love and support have kept our hearts and heads high during these past years. In fact, it is amazing to us to see that our Protestant friends have been the most eager to celebrate this long-awaited reconciliation. We still feel united to them, as much as ever.

The other thing I would like to share concerns my health. Some months ago I mentioned in the Newsletter that I had passed out twice while driving and the doctors were conducting tests to find out why. Naturally, some of you have asked what happened.

The results have really been good. After extensive (and expensive) tests, they found that my heart is in good shape. The only thing the doctors could figure out was that my heart had such a slow beat (sometimes in the 30's) that, when coupled with an occasional missed beat, not enough oxygen always reached the brain. Their medical answer was to insert a pacemaker which gives an electrical impulse to the heart and keeps it at 60 beats a minute. So I'm back to jogging and all those good things. (After 7 years I will need to get the battery replaced.)

So we want to thank you for all your prayers and, most especially, that Rachel seems to have been healed of asthma at our February conference!

Dear Judith,

Question: My seventeen-year old son was recently diagnosed with depression. The hospital referred us to a local psychiatrist for medication and treatment. We believe in the power of prayer to heal our son. Should we see the psychiatrist in addition to prayer? My son is also a believer.

Answer: Your question will touch the hearts of our readers. Many families have been touched in some way by this confusing disorder. Depression has been described as the "common cold" of this century. One in five people will suffer from the debilitating effects of this disorder during the course of his or her

lifetime. It is estimated that twelve million people annually in this country suffer from depression. Half of this nation's suicides are attributed to clinical depression. Depression left untreated can gradually affect every aspect of life. In some cases, it can become chronic, affecting not only the emotional well-being, but physical health as well.

At CHM we encourage treatment with a combination of psychotherapy, inner healing prayers and medication, if necessary. You didn't state the severity or duration of your son's depression. Certainly a long-standing, severe clinical depression requires antidepressants for a prescribed period of time.

A growing consensus among scientists is that dysfunctions like depression are caused by disruptions of normal brain chemistry. Subconscious issues are thought to alter brain chemistry. We have discovered that deep, traumatic childhood wounds, when left unprocessed and unhealed, can produce depression. Most studies show that drug treatments work best when administered along with counseling or psychotherapy.

Many Christians have expressed concern about taking antidepressants; yet they feel perfectly at ease taking an aspirin for a headache. We need to educate ourselves about any drug the doctor asks us to take in order to appreciate its beneficial effects.

During the last decade research into brain chemistry has produced a group of highly specific antidepressant drugs that have few negative side-effects. They work rather quickly to alleviate the symptoms of depression.

Most of these drugs are effective in balancing the brain chemistry. Some drugs, however, such as Prozac have helped countless numbers of people regain emotional stability, and yet may produce adverse side-effects. Therefore, it is extremely important to remain under the professional care of a competent psychiatrist when using any prescribed antidepressant. (We are very blessed here at CHM to have Dr. Tom Wikstrom, Christian psychiatrist, who helps those who come to us for prayer but also need professional medical help). I do recommend that you find a Christian therapist who can work closely with a psychiatrist or doctor in prescribing the appropriate medicine for your son.

A professional psychiatric evaluation is necessary to determine if your son needs an antidepressant. If he does, a combination of prayer and psychotherapy should bring him the healing he is seeking.

If medication is not necessary he could be experiencing "situational depression" (i.e., caused by a particular situation) which many

of us temporarily experience when we live through intense conflict, loss, change, or anxiety. For a time we may feel depressed, sad or unhappy. If these symptoms gradually clear up as the problem subsides, he is probably suffering from situational depression that can be resolved with counseling or psychotherapy and prayer.

Sometimes prayers for generational healing is necessary, especially if depression can be traced back through your ancestry. Occasionally, deliverance prayers may also be necessary if demonic forces are at work. Discernment and the direction of the Holy Spirit are necessary in deciding the appropriate treatment for your son.

Certainly,

- 1. Prayer for inner healing is needed (sometimes this alone will be enough).
- 2. Counseling will be very helpful.
- 3. If the depression is severe, psychiatric help and the prescription of an antidepressant will be needed
- 4. It's just possible that prayer for deliverance will also be necessary.



DELIVERANCE SEMINAR REPORT Dr., Jackie Canepa

Christian Healing Ministries' last seminar for 1993 has come and gone. Those who attended the Deliverance seminar were well-pleased with what they learned and with healing received. Over three-fourths reported healing of one sort or another — 39% received deliverance, 29% received inner healing, and 16% received physical healing. While the number of people receiving deliverance was uncharacteristically high, it is understandable in the light of what this seminar emphasized — deliverance.

Some comments given about the seminar were: "sound teaching, excellent role models"; "well done, good pace, wholeness in approach, well designed and organized"; "good information in an organized manner — a good balance, yet I still want more on how to pray for deliverance"; "You are doing wonderful things, keep up the good work."

All participants (except one) reported they had received what they came for; although one did say, "Yes, although I'm not sure what I came for"; and another noted, "received about 2/3 rds." The one negative comment given was, "No, but I received what God brought me here for."

Healings reported were:

Inner healing from in-utero rejection, and healing in my relationship with my parents.

When F. and S. prayed for generational rejection, fear, and a spirit of self-hatred, I was delivered. For

the first time that I can remember, my thoughts were quiet when I laid down. It is like voices have stopped that were so accusing.

Healed of the guilt, hate, painful memories of all the dirt.

Relieved of a spirit of fear passed on by Mother and Grandmother which has pervaded all of my life.


Set free of the Dragon named Satan. I feel at peace with a new sense of freedom.

As we look back at CHM's 1993 seminars, we find that those people who attended have overwhelmingly been pleased with the teaching and healing they have received. What has also filled our hearts with joy are the glowing reports back from those of you who have put your teaching/training into practice.

Some of you have used the material to enlarge your prayer ministries by training others in your churches, some have put into practice the training received and report great healing results, some are beginning to develop healing ministries within your churches.

Just a thought in closing, it seems that many more people are interested in learning about healing than in "doing" healing. Could it be that we "do-ers" of healing are the "remnant" talked about in Romans 11:5?

MEDICATION FOR CHRISTIANS?

"Should a Christian take antidepressants, medication for anxiety or antipsychotic medication?" "Am I a failure, weak or morally inferior if I 'need' to take medications?" "If I take medications, then am I a 'bad' witness?"

These are some of the questions and statements I hear frequently from people who do "need" medication but are reluctant to take it.

It seems to me that underlying these questions is the belief that if I take medications, especially for improving mood or treating anxiety, than I am somehow less spiritual or have less faith. The idea that God's grace would, or could, be mediated on a natural level through material (in this case, manufactured chemicals) seems to not be considered. These same people are the ones who insist on the "prayer only" approach to treat their depressions, panic attacks or psychosis, and view medication as unspiritual.

Yet, if I ask them, "If a Christian has a broken leg is it OK for him/her to wear a cast?" In this case they answer, "Yes, it is Okay." Why the difference between these two responses? Why is it "OK" for a Christian with a broken leg to wear a cast, but not "OK" for a Christian to take antidepressants?

I believe the answer lies in the fact that we (in the western world) have an unnatural split in our minds between natural and supernatural, i.e., material and spirit. Somehow grace being mediated through matter is thought to be <u>less</u> spiritual!

The answer to this split in the mind of Western man is, I believe, the miracle and mystery of the Incarnation. If God so deigns to come as our Savior in and through matter (including chemical), then can we not believe that he has so created the natural order that His grace and healing can easily be mediated through a natural level if He so wills?

I am not arguing for the use of medications in all circumstances, but if medications are indicated, I do not feel that Christians should feel guilty or somehow less faithful or spiritual if they take the recommended medications. Indeed this is God's grace and healing in and through matter.

Tom Wikstrom, a psychiatrist for ten years, has a private practice in Jacksonville, FL and also is a part-time staff member at CHM.

Facts About Intercession at CHM

Through her widely-acclaimed books <u>A Door of Hope</u> and <u>When Victims Marry</u>, she shares her story and the steps God brought her through for recovery.

Her sharing of the vital issues essential to the healing of survivors, as well as her openness, commitment to the Word of God, and reliance on the Holy Spirit, promise to inspire and encourage all who attend.


