

Thoughts From Francis



Dear Friends,

In November I was privileged to be one of 27 people invited to a pioneering conference held in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia. Our purpose in gathering was to discuss research into Alternative Medicine, ways of healing that differ from traditional medical methods (allelopathic medicine). Present were doctors studying the effects of love upon healing, a doctor doing research on the effects of the Maharishi's TM, doctors studying the effects of religion upon aging, and an expert on traditional Chinese medicine which utilizes the energy fields of the body.

As you can imagine, this was unfamiliar territory to me. How much of it was good and helpful? Clearly, some approaches ran counter to Christianity and it was unfamiliar, too, to be in the minority. I was the only one asked to speak about Christian prayer for healing although there were other Christians and Jews in the group.

These alternative approaches were popularized by Bill Moyers' fascinating TV program which you may have seen on

PBS. If you saw those five hours of programming you probably wondered, as I did, why there was nothing on Christian healing prayer, which is, after all, the most popular and widely practiced Alternative Medicine practiced in our country. This meeting in Virginia helped me understand some of the reasons for the omission; and hopefully it was an encouragement to the scientific community to start doing research on the value of Christian prayer.

Perhaps the most significant thing about the meeting was that it was sponsored by the Research Department of the National Institute of Health (NIH), a department of the U.S. government (Dr. Wayne Jonas of the Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, DC. was in charge of our meeting).

Positive Aspects

Some hopeful ideas were presented at the meeting and I would like to share them with you:

1) The medical profession as a whole is becoming increasingly open to considering alternatives to traditional medicine as helpful and valid.

Through the influence of research and the influence of authors like Dr. Bernie Siegel and Dr. Scott Peck, doctors now see that many factors, including a person's spirituality, are key

elements in healing the sick. Doctors are no longer simply disease-centered but are more willing to consider the whole person and factors such as personal relationships, diet, and environment, together with the spiritual and emotional health of the patient as factors in physical healing.

2) The medical profession now seems to be at a crucial point where they are becoming open to doing serious research on the value of prayer for healing!

Causes for Concern

The not-so-good news is that we also face some significant problems in developing credibility with the medical establishment. We can change these, but the first step is to be aware of them. Here are some of the primary problems as I see them:

1) Christians, as a group, to this point in history have not been serious about connecting with the medical profession and doing research. I know there are exceptions (such as, Oral Robert's' City of Faith, when it existed), but the people I met who are actually doing research into alternative medicine seem to have little or no contact with Christians who pray for the sick.

Contrast this with one MD., who gave a talk on more than 400 research

A Lesson in Grief by Judith MacNutt

The day was August 2, 1993, our daughter Rachel's 12th birthday. We had just returned from Marywood Retreat Center where our marriage had been blessed by Bishop John Snyder. Several close friends had stayed over at our home to celebrate Rachel's birthday. Only one possible birthday gift had been discussed in our home for the last two years a horse! Considering the responsibility of owning a horse we had been very prayerful about this decision. Finally we decided to take the plunge.

Two days before her birthday a friend of ours, Elaine Flaherty, had located and moved "Big Red" secretly to a stable near our home. Big Red was a beautiful 16-hands, eight-year-old gelding who was personality plus. As Rachel approached the stable, supposedly to look at a possible horse to purchase, she noticed her dad (Francis), and David, her brother, and other friends standing around what looked like an empty stall decorated with balloons, birthday banners and streamers. She innocently asked, "What's going on?" When Rachel looked more closely at the stall, Big Red lifted his head through the half-door stall and suddenly they were face to face.

She said, "Big Red, what are you doing here?" (she had looked at him a week before). She turned to me with a questioning look. I said through tears of joy, "He's yours!" The intense joy that enveloped her entire being erupted! She ran from Francis and me, to Red, to friends laughing and crying at the same time. Her dream had come true!

They became fast friends! Rachel spent every spare moment grooming, feeding,

and riding him. She talked about him constantly! I teased her that she was in love. Wonderful transformations took place in Rachel and in Red during the next five months. They settled into a training schedule with lots of extra time for fun and carrots. (He would give her a kiss for a carrot!)

Two days after Christmas while visiting Red at the stable we noticed he kept trying to lie down. We called the vet who came immediately. Over the next nine hours he worked with Red. Around 2:30 a.m. the decision was made to send Red to the vet hospital two-hours away. He had a severe case of colic. The surgeon operated on Red immediately on arrival, but it was too late. At 8:39 a.m., December 28th, Red had to be put to sleep.

The loss of this beloved horse has been shattering to our entire family, but especially to Rachel. She lost her best friend. We have been going through a grieving process which has been much deeper than we expected.

God, however, had prepared Rachel for this great loss.

The night before Red's death Rachel woke us up around 3 a.m. I heard her ask Francis if I was asleep. She asked me to come into her room; she needed to talk. She told me that she had awakened and seen a woman dressed in a white gown sitting at the foot of her bed. The woman had long brown hair and seemed to be praying. Rachel couldn't see her face but thought it was me. Then, after a few seconds, the figure mysteriously disappeared; Rachel wasn't afraid but wanted to know what I thought.

We prayed together and thanked God that He had sent an angel to Rachel. After a short time, Rachel drifted off to sleep. I continued to pray, slowly realizing that God had sent this angel to strengthen Rachel. At that time we were totally unaware of what was to


come. I thank God for sending this angel. Rachel has been deeply saddened by the loss of Red, but at the same time she has also experienced a remarkable grace.

A few thoughts about grief: When my mother died twenty years ago, I reacted with anger and guilt. I remained very private, denying the comfort and healing that were necessary. As a result the grief and anger remained locked away deep in my heart (and body). It has taken many years for God to heal my broken heart because of my own loss.

When Red died, the grief was overwhelming for our entire family. This time, however, we turned to each other and to close friends for comfort and prayer. The difference in the two ways of approaching grief was remarkable! Our loving, supportive community has helped us carry our loss, making the burden so much lighter.

A few have said ... "He was only a horse!" How many people we have prayed with over the years who lost "only" a dog, a cat or a horse and years later, because they were denied their grief they still carried deep and painful memories about the loss. Dr.

- One young man came to us as a result of trying to commit suicide by jumping off a bridge. He displayed some destructive and obsessive behaviors. His parents suspected that he was retarded. Part of his problem stemmed from intense rage at his father. As a result of his counseling and prayer at CHM, he has now graduated with a bachelor's degree, and is continuing work on a master's degree. This highly gifted artistic young man is now healthy, whole, and happy — enjoying a solid relationship with Jesus Christ which he didn't have before.
- Two totally unrelated women came to CHM with much mental confusion and depression. Both had lost a loved one and in their grief process had become involved with New Age literature and the possibilities of communicating with the dead. Counseling, prayer, and learning (Continued on page 5.)

Wallace Sife, Ph.D., states in his book, *The Loss of a Pet*, that society is more than ready to acknowledge the death of a human family member as a legitimate cause for mourning, but it is slow to sympathize with those who lose companion animals. The loss of a horse or any animal can be shattering, and according to Sife, such a reaction is perfectly normal, but because such a loss isn't accepted as a reason for prolonged grief, we may need help in learning to mourn the loss of such cherished friends.

A sad statement on our society is that we have to be given permission to take the time we need to mourn the loss of beloved friends, especially human friends, but sometimes animal pets as well. Grief is a major wound that takes time to heal. Grieving is the natural way of working through the loss of a loved one. It is God's way of healing our broken hearts. Grieving is not our enemy; it's a friend, but it does take time. Scripture reminds us to comfort those who mourn. To those of you who have

God's truth about this through scripture resulted in both being set free of New Age ideas and of depression. Now they both attend church, actively study the bible, and are committed to a joyful relationship with our Lord Jesus.

- One Satanic Ritual Abuse victim has been healed to the point where she no longer has flashbacks, no longer dissociates, has withdrawn from all medication, and has a healthy relationship with Jesus Christ.
- About a dozen people experiencing marital difficulties, especially in the area of sexual intimacy have come to CHM this past year. The one thing all had in common was that

each was fantasizing about someone other than the spouse. Learning that scripture is very clear about not looking at a person with lust and that this fantasizing is not of the Lord, each confessed and repented of the sin. They received prayer to cut them free from the object of their fantasy and for a renewal of their mind. All report renewed and blessed marital intimacy with their spouses.

These stories illustrate just a few of the wonderful healings and restorations that the Lord has performed through CHM volunteers and staff. Thanks and blessings to all of you who are supporting us in carrying out God's will. The verse quoted above aptly describes what we are all about:

studies on the effects of TM (Transcendental Meditation) upon health. I know of a few Christian studies, but nothing on this scale. As a group we simply do not connect, do not communicate on a level that most doctors or researchers can relate to. They are not impressed, for the most part, by testimonies seen on TV. The fact that I was the only Christian in the healing ministry invited to the meeting clearly indicates the need for more communication.

2) Part of the reason for the lack of communication is, I believe, the perception that Christians are close-minded and condemnatory of anything new. I would like to emphasize here that, as you know, we at Christian Healing Ministries strongly disapprove of anything that might involve demonic activity, and much of our ministry involves deliverance from evil spirits. Certainly we do need to sift things out, but what I'm talking about is a kind of a superior, prideful attitude that evangelical, Pentecostal Christians seem to take, by not only disagreement with people but seeming to condemn them. At the end of my presentation, one couple from England, for example,

asked me, "Why do the Christians we meet condemn us to hell?"

The people I met at the meeting were very open to what I had to say, including a good half-hour on the need for discerning the presence of evil spirits. Many of the talks I found to be helpful and they had nothing to question. Yet those speakers have been lumped into New Age. Other speakers I would certainly not agree with and I would regard their approaches as dangerous and New Age in the bad sense of the term. As a group I found them to be sincere spiritual seekers, looking for truth and trying to be loving. I see them as open to the Gospel — if it were ever truly presented to them.

3) Some of their research was fascinating in its implications. One doctor, for instance, had left his medical practice to do research on the effects of love in healing disease. He had performed experiments showing that directing love to groups of cancer cells actually helped heal cancer. I don't see that any Christian need question the value of that kind of research. Wouldn't it be wonderful if that kind of microscopic research were done when we pray for patients with cancer?

In short, we need, more than ever, to be able to sift out: What is of God? What is good in the natural order (created by God), such as the healing power of love? And what is demonic? But mostly I would like to celebrate a new openness in the medical community. I would also like to be able to celebrate a new openness in the-Christian community, an ability to discern what needs to be forsaken in the broad movement known as New Age, but joined with an ability to recognize those areas that are not New Age at all, but where we can all learn and discover.



He was a solid evangelical pastor, trained to believe in the power of human reason and the reliability of the scientific method. Don says that his world view worked well until God shattered his perceptions through the power of signs and wonders.
